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

## Elan Valley AGM 2022 Report - a joint effort Powys Weekend & AGM. Friday 22nd to Sunday 24th April 2022.

## Friday.

Twenty-nine members plus 4 guests arrived on Friday afternoon at the start of our first AGM weekend for three years at the Metropole hotel in Llandrindod Wells, Powys, Wales for fellowship and riding around this beautiful location. And, oh yes, they did let us back after our previous visit many moons ago.

Most arrived from the four corners of England (and the odd corner of Wales) a few met up for lunch at The Lion Hotel, Leintwardine on their way to the hotel and rode in together. Not the least of which was your co-authors own posse from Cambridgeshire and Warwickshire where Gordon (Ed) and Chris ('No2') met Dr John and guests Anthony and Matt for a 'shakedown' ride to AGM HQ by way of practice. The group almost got altitude sickness riding over Clee Hill but the views more than compensated whilst we in turn compensated for the wind!

Everybody arrived safely with no reports admitted of any mishaps or incidents on-route; the only issue was Neil's party beating us to The Lion and cleaning them out of food leaving nothing for us!! Three or four members who, for various reasons could not ride, came by car. Following registration and settling into our rooms we all met in the bar (where else although some preferred to settle straight into the bar) for a pre-dinner drink and a catch up since we last met face to face at Brooklands, September 2021. Some anonymous members tried and doggedly stuck to the local Welsh Lager throughout. The food was excellent and the seating arrangement facilitated small groups able to socialise and get to know our guests one of whom had only passed his test in December 2021 (Shhhhh). Chris and I 'hosted' three guests, namely his brother Anthony and friend (yes, he has one) Matt O'Rourke, in addition to my daughter Clair. Following dinner our organiser and leader, Neil, gave a briefing for the Saturday ride including the drop off system to ensure we lost no one and arrived together at our coffee and lunch stops together; noteworthy that we had a 100% success rate.

## Saturday.

Saturday dawned cloudy with a fresh easterly breeze accompanied by a drip-drop of rain so was a little cool to start,

dispelled by some 'hot' riding later.

18 bikes left the Metropole Hotel at
9.30 following the usual photo call
and pre-ride briefing, with others
following by car.





The route quickly took us around fantastic country roads to our first stop at The Bear Hotel in Llandovery for tea, coffee and biscuits. Your co-author was so enthralled with the riding, he has to admit to not knowing where we were. When I asked our host at The Bear some member, who shall remain nameless, said we were in 'Lovey-Dovey' which sent the host into a fit of the giggles — she explained we were in Llandovery. The proprietor, Jean also told me that if I contacted her privately we could get far better rates than 'the internet' — I am still not sure if this was for the group or just me?!?!

The hosts at the Bear could not have been more attentive (particularly with the 'Miracle Biscuits' where there were more when we left than arrived) and a social media blogger, or was it vlogger (that's a video blogger) took many photographs and filmed us from a drone; many of the pictures can be seen on our Facebook site as well as the 'Earths Eye Media' website. ## **IFMR** India

## January

The year started with a bang on 2nd January when IFMR participated in the mega show of ABC, All Biking Community of Bangalore at Kunigal, 70 km from the starting point one way. 13 riders from IFMR had registered for the same. It was a carnival affair at the venue, with lots of show, music, competition etc. All had a great time meeting other biking communities of Bangalore.

Over Night Ride to Coimbatore/Munnar from 21st to 24th January along with Cochin and Thrissur Sub Chapters. It was a mega event, had all the possible ingredients of fellowship, joint meeting and Charter of Coimbatore Chapter. 12 riders from IFMR India Chapter registered for the same, reached Coimbatore after covering a distance of 320 km, met members from Cochin and Thrissur in the evening and had a gala meeting with the members of Coimbatore Chapter. In a grand function Coimbatore Chapter was chartered, by IPP Ajit Ram, in the presence of over 70 Rotary members. Next morning close to 30 riders left for Munnar, a hill station close to 200km. On reaching Munnar we were joined by a few more bikers from the Cochin sub chapter. In the evening there was a joint meeting of all the chapters in the presence of a PDG from Cochin District. In the evening it was Fellowship time, the next day was a relaxed day, kept for sightseeing and off-road rides. On the 24th morning it was time to say goodbye and our Bangalore riders left together for a ride of 550 km to back home. It was a super-duper ride and event.

#### **February**

This month's first Sunday was scheduled for Kokkare Belluru, a bird sanctuary, 100 km one way from the starting point, it was fixed for 6th February. There were 18 riders registered for the same. After a midway breakfast halt, we reached the sanctuary by 10 am and saw many migratory birds coming from the northern hemisphere, especially the giant Pelicans. It was a treat to watch them, took many pictures and left for back home, all were home for lunch.

#### March

The monthly ride for March was scheduled to a place called Shivagange, 110 km away. 13 riders had registered for it. As per schedule we went to this temple town situated on a hilltop.

Had very good darshan of Lord Shiva and slowly we returned back to Bangalore in the afternoon, a good ride with a lot of fellowship in the way.

## April

From April 8th to 10th, an overnight ride was organized for a ride to Avalanche, an upper reach of Ooty hill station, 15 riders

Park and then Masinagudi National Park, the place is 27 km above Ooty with an amazing view of Lake downhill. It was a forest reserve with total privacy.

April monthly ride was a short and a sweet one to popular hilltop in Bangalore called NANDI HILLS, 45 km one way. The date was 3rd April, 15 riders had registered for the same, had a sumptuous breakfast at the foothill restaurant, NANDI UPACHAR. Despite less distance, it was a challenge to climb the hilltop, fortunately it was open to the public, most of the time due to the heavy rush the hill top gets closed for the general public. On the return journey, took a detour towards Doddaballpur and returned to Bangalore in the afternoon. Another great ride and bonhomie.

IFMR INDIA chapter had scheduled a long 20 day ride to seven sisters state in North East India, covering Assam,

Arunachal



Pradesh, Manipur, Nagaland, Mizoram, Tripura and Meghalaya, covering 2800km from Guwahati. 8 riders had registered for same; dates were 25th April to 15th May. All 8 bikes of individual riders were sent to Guwahati one week before from Bangalore. All 8 riders flew to Guwahati together

and flagged off the long journey on 27th April, first state to cover was Arunachal Pradesh, visited Bomdila, Dirang and Tawang crossed China

Dirang and Tawang, crossed China border pass at Sela Pass and Bumla Pass at an altitude of 15200 ft. Entered Manipur, visited Imphal and touched base with the Myanmar border, and did mandatory sightseeing. Entered Nagaland state capital Kohima, stayed there for three nights, visited all around, including world famous Horn Bill Village. In between came back to Assam's Kaziranga's One Horn Rihno Sanctuary. From there we went to Kolasib in Mizoram and Dharmanagar in Tripura and finally to Shillong in Meghalaya. On 14th May we were back at Guwahati to take

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lorry and flew back to Bangalore for a gala reception at the airport by a few IFMR friends.

#### May

The monthly ride for May was scheduled for 1st May, being the first Sunday of the month, destination was Man Groove of IFMR'ian Naveen Scindia, a 125 km from Bangalore. 12 riders joined the ride for it. It was a great experience for all to visit this Man Groove farm, everyone enjoyed the hospitality extended by Naveen. After spending over 3 hrs. all returned back to Bangalore. Great time spent by all in a private place.

## June

IFMR Nordic has 140 members in 5 different Nordic countries: Denmark 48, Finland 19, Island 15, Norway 21 and Sweden 37 members.







On the third day, after breakfast, we started with an hour-long canal cruise in Copenhagen, discovering the Danish capital from the water. Then, on our motorcycles, we headed along

the winding coastal road to North Zealand. We happily arrived at the Helsingør Golf Club for lunch. Luckily, just after we entered the building, a short but very violent rain shower broke out.



The next place we visited was the Nakkehoved Light Tower lighthouse, where the guide told us incredibly interesting stories associated with the place.

After taking a souvenir photo, we returned to the hotel, where we enjoyed a wonderful dinner in the evening.

On the fourth day, we started our journey towards Roskilde at 8:45 a.m. through picturesque, winding roads. We stopped at the cathedral, which happened to be under special protection that day due to the planned arrival of the Queen of Denmark. Continuing on local roads, we reached the Brorfelde Observatoriet astronomical observatory located near Holbæk. The Brorfelde Schmidt Telescope used by University of Copenhagen students is still located there.

We had lunch in Karrebæksminde, a beautiful place on the Kroen canal with a view of the Græshoppebroen drawbridge. After lunch, we went to Camp Adventure, where we climbed the 135m high Forest Tower, the highest point in Zealand. That was the end of the rally program. Michał and Bendt headed towards Sweden, crossing the famous bridge again. We stayed overnight in a hotel in Lund.

On the fifth day, with plenty of time and beautiful weather, we decided to take a scenic route along the southern coast of the Baltic Sea to Karlskrona.

Along the way, we visited the Atlex Stener stone circle, the charming town of Simrishamn, and the birthplace of Absolut, Ahus, where we had lunch at a restaurant that was also a meeting place for the Rotary Club Ahus.

## 4) International Tour Swietokrzyskie I– September 2022



For the first time, our IFMR-Poland Club had the opportunity to meet in the Świetokrzyskie Mountains.

The organizers were Janusz Cieślik and Jerzy Staszczyk from RC Kielce. Even though our province is not impressive in size, the choice of routes and tourist attractions was not easy. In short, to see all significant attractions, the meeting would have to last about a week.

We were accommodated and warmly welcomed at the foot of the Karczówka Mountain in the hotel of the same name. From the observation terrace 100 meters above, a panoramic view of the entire city could be seen. The next day, we set out on a trip to Sandomierz, a medieval gem of our province.

We drove through the Świętokrzyskie Mountains, a picturesque gorge of the Lubrzanka River, and roads that allowed us to admire the panorama of mountain ranges. Upon arriving in Sandomierz, the guide introduced us to the rich history of the city. We visited the market square, the Długosz House, the Cathedral, and Collegium Gostomianum – the oldest secondary school in Poland, which has been functioning since 1602. We had lunch in a picturesque restaurant under the walls of the Opatowska Gate and then headed to the next point of the program, the ruins of Krzyztopór Castle in Ujazd. Built by Krzysztof Ossoliński in the 17th century, it fell into ruins after over 100 years. It was one of the largest magnate residences in Europe. Unfortunately, we could only admire it from the outside as the area was closed due to the filming of a Bollywood movie.

As time was pressing, after the guide's story about the history, we set off to the next point of the program – Szydłów, a town surrounded by 14th-century defensive walls with a history dating back to the 12th century. After all these attractions, we arrived at the hotel at dusk for a well-deserved rest, as the next day there were more attractions waiting for us. On Saturday, the first point of the program was one of the greatest natural attractions of our province – the Raj Cave.

Then we went to Jedrzejów to see the 3rd largest collection of sundials in the world. The museum was created from a collection gathered by Feliks Przypkowskiego, a doctor, and an amateur astronomer, and the entire collection is housed in a tenement house, which was his home.

The return journey led us through Samsonów with the ruins of a foundry furnace from the first half of the 19th century, and

then we arrived at our next natural attraction – the "Bartek" oak tree, one of the oldest.

After lunch, we went, not on motorcycles, to the 60 km distant Opatów for a grape harvest at the Brzostowiczów vineyard, which produces wine using traditional methods. The owner of the vineyard is a member of RC Opatów.

The event also has a charitable purpose – we also supported the Sister Chmielewska Foundation with our funds to maintain her help centers in difficult times. It was fun, as seen in the photos, and we could taste the wines produced "by hand" and "by foot."

The weather was excellent, as agreed, except for a short "shower" on Friday. We said goodbye with regret after spending a wonderful time together.

## 5) Winter meeting in Herbarium Hotel & Spa – December 2022

The natural circumstances are not favorable for using motorcycles, and the need for meeting in the IFMR Polska group is always significant.



Therefore, during the December weekend, our group of friends from IFMR Polska decided to meet again and spend the weekend together.

We provided training to people who are interested in motorcycles.













Six, twenty something year olds set off on an adventure determined to ride from Delhi to the highest motorable road in the world, Kardungla pass at an altitude of 18380ft. The decision to take on this challenge was a result of a





With the planning and prep phase done over an year of yes we will do it, no we can't do it to, let's do it come what may, we transported our trustee steads to Delhi. And no surprises when we rode into Manali all pumped up for the upward climb, only to find the road to Rohtang pass closed due to snowfall. This was during the pre-internet era and 'googling' weather conditions wasn't even a part of the dictionary.

We waited out the storm and took to the winding road from Manali to Rohtang and into the valley of Keylong.







It was a hard ride over the next few days as we rode through the high altitude passes such as Baralacha la (16000ft), Tangnangla pass (17000ft) before we reached Pang. It was then on to Leh. From Leh we rode to Kardungla pass the highest motorable road in the world. Then it was back to Delhi. It took us 34 days to complete this ride.






There is so much more to this journey than just an adventure. This was a right of passage for every rider. Since then I've been on many rides, some even more ambitious than this one. That said, this is by far the best and most memorable ride of my life.



Little did we know this was a Guinness record of riding to the highest motorable road on 100cc motorcycles with 2 on a bike until, someone told us so but, Guinness said no as we had not informed them beforehand. Oh how naive we were.

All this was way back in circa 1991.



The spirit of adventure has indeed imbided itself amongst our young men and women to-day, and very often we have an opportunity of reading about, or watching on television the dating feats of adventure loving people in India.

On 14th June 1991, five young men of Bangalore would be leaving on a challenging trip to Kardung-La Pass on their motor cycles. Kordung-La Pass is the highest motorable road in the world. At a height of 18,300 feet above Msl, it is a snow clad mountain pass during most parts of the year. The route that our young men should be following remains closed to traffic from october to June and due to dangerous terrain during the monsoon season as well. Their planned route would be Bangalore - Delhi - Bilaspur - Mandi - Kyelong - Leh - Kordung - La Pass - Leh Kyelong - Simla - Dehradun -New Delhi - Bangalore

According to Prashanth Babu, a B.Com., graduate of Christ college, he and his comrades hope to return to the city around 15-07-1991.
